#### **Upcoming Events**



#### Financial Report for September, 2018

#### **Finance Report for September, 2018**

It pleases me to report that ending September the bottom line on the finances of Trinity Church were back in positive territory.

If you remember, last month we ended August in the red by \$2,317.14. Not good! But we finished September in the black with a balance of \$1,310.17. Much better!

Two factors contributed to this ending balance. 1) Revenue was up \$5,321.88 from the previous month while 2) expenses were down by \$2,105.26. Had we not had that negative carryover from August, we would have been in even better shape. Let's hope—and pray—that this positive direction continues.

Another wonderful check appeared in September—our payment from the Wood County Fair Board for our/your work tending the gates at the annual Fair. This year we earned \$12,134.24. Outstanding!! Of course, we needed to pay Christ Church in Portage for the assistance we received from its members. I sent them a check for \$1,429.15. That gave us a net earning of \$10,705.09. While that money goes into our Fair Fund account and not into the general operating money, it will provide funding for scholarships, camping experiences, baseball teams and other projects that crop up throughout the year.

Again, many thanks to all of you who worked the gates and brought your friends and neighbors to help you as well. This makes a big difference in our ability to engage in many projects each year.

As Pastor Andrea instructed us in her message recently, we should work as if we are doing it with and for Jesus. And when we work with that in mind, Jesus provides the rewards.
