





Breakthrough Goals for 2019

Each year as a church we are asked to set goals for the year that will help us reach out and share the love of God with new people. Our Ad Councils discussed these goals in the fall of 2018. While these goals are numerical, please remember that each number has a life attached to it, a life that can be transformed by the grace of Jesus Christ, if we as his disciples will be willing to live into his call on our lives! In order to meet and exceed these goals we will need to work together as a community of faith remembering that we are called to serve others and lead them to faith in Christ.

These goals are based around the 5 practices of fruitful congregations:

Passionate Worship: Average weekly worship attendance of 130

Radical Hospitality: Total professions of faith 7; Total baptisms 5

Intentional Faith Development: Total number of small groups/Sunday school classes 10, Average attendance in small groups 65

Risk Taking Mission and Service: Average number of members in outreach/missions 20

Extravagant Generosity: Average weekly giving to the annual budget: \$5400; Percentage of apportionments paid 100%

The Council of Bishops has called a Special Session of the General Conference of The United Methodist Church to be held February 23-26, 2019 in St. Louis, Missouri. The

purpose will be to receive and act on a report the from Commission on a Wav Forward based on the recommendations of the Council of Bishops. The 32member Commission was authorized by General Conference 2016 and ap-

pointed by the Council of Bishops to examine paragraphs in The Book of Discipline concerning human sexuality and exploring options to strengthen the unity of the church.

At the General Conference at least 3 plans for the future of the UMC will be discussed, debated, and voted on by the delegates of the conference. Those three plans are: The One Church Connectional Plan. The Conference Plan, and the Traditionalist Plan. 

Finance Report for December, 2018

During 2018 I seemed to have not only used this column to keep you up to date on the financial situation of Trinity Church but also to sometimes encourage, cajole, and even beg you to assess your financial commitment to the church, hoping that its bank account would always be written in black ink.

Some months were really a struggle. A few months were somewhat better. But I'm pleased to report to you that we ended the year in a positive position.



November of \$225.98 and together all that gave us a start into January, 2019 of \$9,428.01.

Now \$9,000 sounds like a nice cushion going into a new year—and it's appreciated but it's not a lot. Each January year-end payroll taxes are due, the insurance on the building is due as well as several other smaller expenses that always become payable in that month.

Bottom line: while I appreciate everything you did for the church in December, I need—the church needs—you to continue your financial commitment to God's house. Many of our people are trying their best to do some good things in house and throughout the community, and they need our support to grease their skids.
