Greetings Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

This month we begin the Lenten season, a time of grace, renewal and repentance. Lent is a time for us to examine our faith lives and recommit to our journey with God. During Lent we prepare our hearts to receive anew the Good News of the Resurrection! I remember being a little girl and going to church for Ash Wednesday. The Pastor would mark the sign of the cross on my forehead and I would do my best to push my bangs out of his way, all the while hoping that he wouldn't make my cross too big. I didn't want get laughed at by others or picked on for looking silly. Fast forward a few years to the first time I imposed ashes on the forehead of someone else. The sheriff in our town was a member at the church where I served as a youth pastor. That Ash Wednesday our lead pastor asked that I help out in imposing ashes. he said it would be "Good Practice" for me. So I went down to the front of the sanctuary with him, and armed with my bowl of ashes, I prepared to impose ashes on the first person in line, who just happened to be the sheriff.

I knew as I was making the sign of the cross on his forehead with my thumb that something wasn't right. I was making the cross too big, I had started too far to the side of his head. As bits of ash trickled down his nose he started to laugh under his breath. I finished my cross of ashes which spanned his entire forehead. After him I started making the crosses smaller, remembering my dread as a child and not wanting to impose undue laughter on others in the congregation. My friend, the sheriff, took it in good stride. At the end of the service he said, "You must think I have some things to repent for" I laughed and said "Don't we all?!"

Don't we all? Don't we all have some things to repent for this year and every year? That's the thing about Lent, it gives us a fresh start. A chance to recalculate our journey's path if we have been going off course. You know, since that day I have learned to make my ashen crosses smaller, but I will never forget that first time I got to impose ashes on someone else' forehead. It is an honor to serve the body of Christ in that way. To call us back to the path of God, to invite us to recalculate our journey's path, and to reevaluate our faith lives.

I hope as we journey through Lent together that we will find new ways to connect with God in Christ. I hope that together we will grow as a followers of Jesus, and I hope that we will truly celebrate with joy and anticipation the Resurrection on Easter morning!



On March 23, 1869, eight women gathered at Tremont Methodist Episcopal Church in Boston, Massachusetts, and organized the Woman's Foreign Missionary Society – what later became the United Methodist Women. Those women (through their egg money, bazaars, suppers and pennies) raised money to send a doctor, Clara Swain, and a teacher, Isabella Thoburn, to India as missionaries to serve the women of that nation.

Since then, for 150 years, United Methodist Women has evolved to become the largest women's faith-based service and advocacy organization, underwriting programs that provide life-changing opportunities for women, children and youth. Hooray! for the UM Women who carry this legacy into the future.

Finance Report for January, 2019

Last month I reported to you that Trinity Church closed out 2018 with a positive balance of over \$9,000. It was great to have that buffer coming into the new year, but I also cautioned that we would need every penny of it because of the heavy bills that always appear in January. And they did!

January brought us higher than normal utility bills, greater than expected maintenance costs and the quarterly insurance payment on the church property that is just under \$2,000 itself. Although we pay the withholding taxes on our employees each month for Federal tax and Social Security, we also have to make a quarterly payment in January for the taxes withheld for State, City and school taxes.

To make our financial situation even more difficult, we had to cancel worship services one Sunday because of the weather. The following Sunday the weather had improved somewhat but our attendance was very low. Resultingly, our receipts were not good for the month.

The bottom line is that we received \$11,145.32 during January, had to spend \$20,671.44 and considering the \$9,428.01 we carried forward from December, we ended January \$98.11 in the hole. That's not exactly the way I'd like to start the new year. I'm hoping that we can make up for lost ground in February.

Please do your best to help our church with its ongoing financial challenges.
