Greetings Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

As we enter the month of July, we begin with the bang of fireworks and celebration as we remember the birthday of our nation. I am reminded of one of my favorite patriotic songs, America the Beautiful. Did you know that this song was based on the poem by poet, and writer, Katharine Lee Bates. Bates took a trip to Colorado Springs, Colorado in 1893 and when she reached the top of Pike's Peak she was inspired to write of the beauty of God's creation. The first verse of the poem reads:

O beautiful for spacious skies, For amber waves of grain, For purple mountains majesties Above the fruited plain! America! America! God shed His grace on thee, And crown thy good with brotherhood From sea

to shining sea! We probably all know that verse quite well. But did you know that the original poem also includes this verse:

O beautiful for glory-tale Of liberating strife, When once or twice, for man's avail, Men lavished precious life! America! America! God shed His grace on thee Till selfish gain no longer stain, The banner of the free! This verse from Bates' original pen, tells of the intent of our founding fathers who sought to make a great nation rooted in freedom. The poem highlights the beauty of the country and the freedom that our constitution is based in.



Of course any time that we talk about freedom, as a pastor, I can't help but remember that we are truly never free until we find our freedom in Christ. And so this month as we celebrate the great freedoms we enjoy here in the United States of America, I call us to be mindful of our siblings in Christ around the world who do not enjoy the same freedom of religion and assembly. For me this is personal because I have visited parts of the world where Christianity is illegal. I have met pastors who have been jailed for distributing Bibles and preaching the gospel. These men and women who have the same job that I have, have

spent time in a prison cell for doing what I do every day. It's a strange reality to think that one's job is illegal in another part of the world. So friends, as we celebrate this year, the wonderful blessings that we enjoy in this country, let us also remember those around the world who risk their lives to follow Jesus. As we live in gratitude for the joys we experience in this life that we've been gifted, then we will also be able to pour out that gratitude into the world around us. Sharing the freedom we've found in the forgiveness of Christ.





Trinity Shirts Available





Financial Report for May, 2019

Although April ended with positive numbers, \$1,734.57 to the good, May did not treat us so well at all. May's expenses were nothing unusual—just the normal expenses we see each month. Church utilities continue to be high. I might have told you before, but the monthly gas bill is \$1,150.00. Combine that with the charges for the phone and internet of \$141.57 and our electric, water and sewer costs of \$573.36 and you can see why I get out of sorts when I'm paying these bills. But these kinds of things we can't escape.

The even larger problem in May was the revenue side of the equation. Our income was way down. We only received offerings of \$13,308.24, a significant drop from receipts in April. Compare that figure with our May expenses and we ran a deficit of \$1,843.62. Hopefully, June will turn us around into a positive position again.

One Special Account we seem to depend on to shore us up, especially later in the year, is the <u>Fair Fund</u>. We always use money from the Fair Fund to pay for scholarships for our college students and summer camp costs for our children. We've also used its money for special projects from time to time and for shoring up other accounts that fall in the hole. Our Hospitality Fund is a good example of a fund that has benefited from the Fair Fund. And we have occasionally needed to use some of its money at the end of the calendar year to finish paying our Conference Apportionments.

That said—it's County Fair time again. Tending the Fair gates has been a wonderful tradition for our congregation. I think it brings some of us together with others at Trinity who we don't already know so well until we work with them at the gates. It also gives us the opportunity to twist the arms of our neighbors, family members and friends to work along side us. And yearly, I know I get to see people step up to my gate who I haven't seen in quite some time. The excitement of the children is the best. It's followed closely by the seniors on Senior Day who are anxious to show you proof that they're old enough to gain free admission. (Any other day these senior women would never admit their age!) I might be tired when I get home, but I'm smiling because of the experience I've enjoyed with people I meet or meet again at the Fair.

And all that said—please SIGN UP for a shift or two or three at the Fair. Do it NOW that I've drawn it to your attention, NOW! You can do it easily by going to our Trinity website at www.bgtrinity.org and clicking the "Fair Gate Signup" button. Or you can sign up on the tables just inside the door at the church. So please grab your calendar and do it NOW!

Our work at the Fair gates earned Trinity Church \$12,000 last summer—and we needed it. However, we had to then pay Christ Church in Portage almost \$1,500 of that money because we needed their help to fill the slots we could not. I'm glad that the Portage folks agree to help us but I'd prefer to have that money available to us. Together, all of us can make it happen and have some fun doing it. Thank you for your consideration and your commitment.



always have to hold it together." She encouraged those in the congregation to not simply respond to grieving people with the words alone, "Let me know if you need something;" rather, Rev. Bensman encouraged

us to offer tangible signs of God's love. Rev. Bensman went on to sav that in her season of grief, the words that brought her great solace were the simple lyrics from the hymn "Jesus Loves Me," especially the sentiments "we are weak, but He is strong," an underlying theme for the conference.

The Solution is love. God's Love. Be in God's Work

Episcopal Address

Bishop Palmer's theme was "How firm a Foundation," that foundation being the Grace of God which can work though our infirmities to get the job done. He stressed that God's power can work through us to bring the "kingdom on earth." Further, both sides of an issue have a tough time existing if we stop to realize and we should be sure we are comfortable with our position before trying to influence others. It's not about us, but about Jesus. He reminded us the institutional

church is only temporary, but the foundation is God's. We can tear down the institution

and rebuild it even more strongly because of God's foundation. He challenged us to not be so narrow we cannot hear the ideas of others, and have brave conversations. We must be brave enough to judge fairly, and brave enough to discuss openly, not trying to catch each other's faults but to live and build on each other's love.

Faith is an active love of God

We gathered for the 50th session of the West Ohio Conference with the "elephant" of policy disagreement. Would our church be torn apart? What could we do to maintain it? We recognized clearly we are a part of a global body and other views must be considered if we are to grow and flourish. This was a time for fear, yet our theme, inspired by Romans 15:13, encouraged hope, in spite of fear. We reaffirmed in every way possible that God was in charge and would lead us through any human misunderstanding

The opening worship focused on remembering those who had gone before us, in particular former Bishop Judith Craig.



SPIRITUAL GIFTS

The Chair of the West Ohio Conference Nominating Committee, Rev. Laura Bensman, shared the evening mes-

sage entitled "Gifts," taken from Ephesians 2:8-10. Rev. Bensman asked the congregation to reflect upon the gifts we were given by those we were remembering, the gifts clergy receive from laity and that laity receive from their clergy. Recalling how flaws fade in the background allowing faithfulness to rise to the top of remembrances. Rev. Bensman shared her personal struggles with grief and reminded the congregation that God is with us even into deep valleys of sorrow. "We need to be reminded, that as Christ's followers we don't

Bishop Mande Muyombo

Mande Muyombo is the Resident Bishop of the North Katanga Conference (which we support) in the Congo. He affirmed church mission is difficult because of money, different standards, and differing



mores, but we must keep the faith. The Faith is in Christ—not the church as an institution. He declared, "Faith is an active love of God," conversely, faith

pleases God. The mission field extends not only to Africa but to the United States as well.

The Bishop Reported much progress has been made in their mission field including:

- --- A hanger for the medical plane
- ---A continuing improvement in the children's home challenge.
- ---Raising pastor's salaries, some as low as \$30.00 a month.
- ---Mutual teaching and learning between his conference and
- ---Improvement in two hospitals.

This progress is due in large measure by funds from the "Light the Way" campaign which has produced over \$2.6 millions of our \$3 millions goal. This year we will add over \$100,000 to that sup-




