This letter will share with you some of the amazing Kingdom building that has occurred this year at BG Trinity because of your extravagant generosity. As you prayerfully consider your giving this year, I want to encourage you to take some time with your pledge card, placing it and your finances in God's hands. How is God calling you to grow in your generosity? How is God calling you to step up in your giving to the ministries of our church so that God's kingdom can be built?

As you consider these questions and fill out your pledge card, we ask that you return your card either to the church office or during our **Consecration Sunday Worship Service on November 3 at 10:30am**. At this service we will combine our two worship services for the day in celebration with music and song to rejoice at the wonderful things God has done this year. A potluck meal will be hosted by the finance team after the worship service with the main dish provided. This service promises to be a morning of joy and celebration, one that is not to be missed. This month as we journey together in stewardship, I look forward to exploring what God has in store for us as a family of faith!

Financial Report for August, 2019

The figures for August were—unexpectedly—much improved. Usually during the summer months we struggle to make ends meet. However, this August we ended the month with a positive balance of \$3,192.56.

That figure was impressive because we came into August with a deficit in our operating account of \$2,367.97. Ouch!

During August we had receipts of \$20,656.01 and expenses of only \$15,095.48. It really was unusual on both ends; better receipts and fewer expenses.

Expenses were down primarily because we paid fewer employees during August. We were without an Education Director and the Choir Director was on summer recess. Additionally, our new secretary was on board for only a few days during the month. And with fewer dollars paid for salaries, few dollars were also required for the church's share of our employees' Social Security.

But September should bring us back to normal.

Another piece of good news came to us in the form of a check from the Wood County Fair Board in the amount of \$13,101.20 for the work all of you did at the fair gates. That's the most we've ever earned! From that we paid our friends at Christ UM Church in Portage \$1,205.10 for the help they gave us at the gates. If you've been reading my reports all year you've had a taste of Trinity's touch-and-go financial situation this year. So, the income from this annual Fair Project is truly welcome.

Many, many thanks to all of you who worked at the fair. Your work is not only appreciated by the Fair Board, but also by your church treasurer as I work to make sure we continue to meet our financial obligations.
